In Memoriam of Warren Pierce Gilmore 1947-2024

Warren Pierce Gilmore was born in Milton, Florida on December 6, 1947 to his loving and devoted parents, the late Deacon James Franklin Gilmore, Sr. and Pollie Marie Walker Gilmore. Warren was a highly respected man of great character, strength, courage, dignity, and wisdom. On Tuesday, August 20, 2024, Warren moved from labor to reward when our Heavenly Father called him home to be with Him.

Warren joined Mt. Pilgrim African Baptist Church at an early age and subsequently accepted Jesus Chris as his personal Lord and Savior. During his teen years, his older sister, and "second Mom", Marie Gilmore Dickerson, taught him to play the piano. He and Marie had a very special bond which extended throughout their adult lives and lasted until her death.

He was educated in the Santa Rosa County Public School System. He attended and graduated from T.R. Jackson School and was a proud member of the Class of 1965. It was at T.R. Jackson where he learned to play the percussions and became the percussion section leader during his senior year of high school. He was also on the track team and ran in long distance track events.

Warren enlisted in the United States Air Force June 1965 and was honorably discharged December 1968 from active duty. During his tenure, he was a Heating System Specialist. He continued to serve his country in the Air Force Reserve until June 1971 in Niagara Falls, New York. During his stay there, he married and from that union two children were born and three children were adopted - Warren Jr., Keisha, Anthony, Kim and Renee. He later moved back to Milton, Florida and found the job that he truly enjoyed at Whiting Field Naval Base where he worked as an Aircraft Mechanic until his retirement in 2003.

After his return to Milton, he re-joined his home church, Mt. Pilgrim African Baptist Church. There he became a deacon and later accepted God's Calling and truly became "A Man after God's Own Heart". Warren was licensed in the ministry in June 1988 and later ordained in September 1988. While at Mt. Pilgrim, Rev. Gilmore baptized an abundance of youth in the Milton community and most of them referred to him as "Pops", "Uncle Warren" or "Unk". Rev. Gilmore faithfully served Mt. Pilgrim until God called him to pastor James Street Baptist Church (JSBC), where he was installed in July 1993. Rev. Warren Gilmore (lovingly referred to as "Rev."), cared deeply for all of his JSBC members. He made it his priority to check on them regularly to just make sure that they were "good". He was an amazing pastor who loved teaching and preaching God's Word to JSBC and surrounding churches. Rev. Gilmore also served the Milton Community as Vice President then President of the Fellowship Churches of Santa Rosa County. After serving God and God's JSBC flock as Pastor, Rev. retired in October 2014. He subsequently received the honor and title of Pastor Emeritus.

Warren met Annie "Vinia" Dortch during a visit at Greater Union Baptist Church in Century, Florida. A couple years later, on March 30, 1996, they were married and to this union three children were born - Pierce, Jerard and Jermaine (the twins). He absolutely loved and adored his family. He and Annie were the best of friends and did everything together and still "courted" each other going on dates every Friday until he became too ill to do so.

Warren was the "coolest" and "most down to earth" Man of God one could ever meet. He loved to laugh as well as make others laugh. His jovial personality and hearty laugh were contagious. He was a jokester and if he knew anything funny about you, you would be reminded of it at almost every encounter with him, followed by the heartiest laugh ever. He loved different genres of music, but Gospel was his favorite. He loved to see the band "12Eleven" perform. His son, Pierce, is the drummer and he considered Pierce's band mates (Daniel, Denver and Eric) his sons and they affectionately called him "Dad".

Warren was preceded in death by his parents, Deacon James Sr. and Pollie Gilmore; and all of his siblings: Carolyn, Willie, Mary, Erskin, Martha, Marie, Nellie and James, and best friends: Esic Rhodes, Murray Hamilton, Alfred Brewton and Donald Brown.

- 5. Clerk's recommendation of enrollment of Messengers, seconded, vote taken and passed unanimously.
- 6. Pastor Bob Lowe moved that the program printed be adopted. Second made for the Adoption of Program by Joel Hunt, vote taken, and passed unanimously.
- 7. Pastor Ray Dye, Pastor of Ferris Hill Baptist Church gave his testimony. He is the new pastor of Ferris Hill, who moved his family from Arkansas to Milton, Florida. He described all the tangible ways in circumstances that God moved, opened doors, and confirmed that he was to be the pastor of Ferris Hill Baptist Church. He gave thanks to God for an active/healthy association and the partnership & friendship of Pine Terrace with Ferris Hill.
- 8. Moderator Jim Stickle presented the Treasurer's Report on pages 4-13 in the Book of Reports. After each item is presented there will be a vote. He explained the breakdown of the Balance Sheet and Budget Report. No questions were entertained. A Motion was made by Johnathan Russell, Pastor of Milton First to accept the Treasurer's Report as printed. It was Seconded by John Everitt of Avalon. The vote was taken and approved.
- 9. Moderator, Jim Stickle also presented the Stewardship Report (2025 Proposed Budget) on pages 14-16. There is an increase in health insurance premiums and the Association plans on having several church growth events. The new budget is increased by 1.41 percent. Pastor Jeremy Holley of Immanuel made a Motion to accept the treasurer's report as printed. Pastor Nathan Brown of Pine Terrace Seconded. No questions entertained. Vote taken with AYES and no NAYS. It was approved.
- 10. Moderator also presented the Nominations Report for 2024-2025 on page 3 of Book of Reports. He read the leadership positions with the names of the new leaders and the needs for open positions; No discussion. A Motion was made by Patty from New Life Church to accept the Nominations Report as printed. Second made. Vote taken to accept the Nominations as printed and it was approved.
- 11. Jim Stickle made a recommendation to accept 2 New Church plants seeking Association Membership: Vietnamese Living Faith with Pastor Robert Lepine and Vietnamese Christian Church with Pastor Christian Phan. Both churches have gone through the credentials process. AMS Jim Waters explained because Vietnamese Living Faith Church is connected to East Side and Vietnamese Christian Church is connected to Santa Rosa Shores, they will not be under a year's "watch-care" and will be full-fledged members after the vote. A Motion was made by Norm Sullivan of Living Truth Church to accept Vietnamese Living Faith Church into the membership of the Santa Rosa Baptist Association. Second was made by Shirley Pierce of Olivet. No discussion. An Aye vote was taken and unanimously approved. Pastor Robert Lepine of Vietnamese Living Faith Church came forward and was extended the right hand of fellowship into the Association. A Motion was made by Jeremy Holley to accept the Vietnamese Christian Church into membership of the Santa Rosa Baptist Association. Second by Brian Unruh of Ferris Hill. No discussion. An Aye vote was taken and unanimously approved. Pastor Christian Phan was not in attendance. Moderator Jim Stickle prayed for Pastor Robert Lepine and Vietnamese Living Faith Church and Vietnamese Christian Church.
- 12. Moderator Jim Stickle introduced Pastor of Pine Terrace, Nathan Brown to give his testimony. Philippians 1:vs 3: 3: I thank my God every time I remember you. 4 In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy 5 because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, 6 being confident of this, that he who began a good

work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." Pastor Brown likened our Associational life and partnership together as a "partnership in the Gospel." "What unites us is stronger than anything that might divide us. In 1972 it was the selfless sacrifice of Ferris Hill that sent out members to plant a church on the northwest side of Milton. In 1973, forty-eight charter members established a church called Pine Terrace; it was known as the Ferris Hill Mission and became the Pine Terrace Baptist church that met in a garage of one of their charter members. So we, at Pine Terrace owe a great debt of gratitude to Ferris Hill".

"When we learned that Ferris Hill, our mother church had fallen into a season of difficulty and was need in of revitalization, after they had done a deep dive into their reality and concluded that they wanted to pursue revitalization, that they wanted to pursue a fostering relationship." Pastor Brown and his wife are licensed to foster through One More Child. They have five biological sons and one adopted son which became official seven months ago. After the adoption training and the adoption process, he said he can no longer read in several places in the Bible about our adoption in Christ in the same way anymore. Pastor Brown approached Pine Terrace church and said "we have to do this." Pastor Brown said God put this burden in his soul and that of his Executive Pastor, Ray Summerlin, who said he would come alongside him and do this. Pine Terrace sent over 12 people and some of them have come to stay to become members of Ferris Hill. Others have completed their one-year-long mission trip and have come back home to Pine Terrace and have loved being a part of what God has done and is doing in them and at Ferris Hill.

"What we have seen this past year in partnership has been nothing but a tremendous blessing. God's hand has been in all of this and we have seen Ferris Hill rise to the challenge. From taking care of some facility issues to taking care of programs, taking care of new staff; some people from Pine Terrace are part of new staff. They began to meet and they prayed and strategized, and covenanted together." They began to pray for a new Pastor, but what resulted is that Pastor Brown got a new friend in Pastor Raymond and Chelsea Dye and their kids. "Christ is exalted, God is blessing, the church is growing, and Ferris Hill baptized 8 in the 4 months since Pastor Ray Dye has been here. Whatever God has started here at Pine Terrace, this association, and Ferris Hill; He will finish for His glory! Let's be on mission together! Amen."

13.. Jim Waters, AMS gave his report. He opened by reading 2 Corinthians 11 with Paul giving his credentials in relation to false prophets. He said Paul lists all the hardships he endured, but what got him daily was his deep concern for all the churches. Bro. Waters then went on to explain and describe the incredible journey of 2024 and the 2nd year to be an AMS and the honor to serve the association. He shared what he's come to understand this past year is, whatever the personal journey, whether it's great, or whether there's challenges; there's one thing that sticks in his craw, is the care for all the churches-daily. He's had the pleasure to speak to many church staff members and pastors; he hears of the wins, the testimonies, the "go-Jesus" moments but he also hears, 'Jim, I've got a challenge.' What he hears many, many times is, "I need a worship leader." What he hears over and over is, "Jim, pray for us, we're struggling." With that said, Jim asked those in attendance to remember to pray for him. He asked specifically that they pray that he would have wisdom as he seeks to come alongside and encourage all of our churches and pastors. Pray that in every situation to the glory of God, that he would have wisdom. He then asked them to write down the scripture of which he prays for our association churches: Acts 9:31 and asked them to pray over the churches with him this prayer as he read Acts: 9:31. "Then the church throughout Judea, Galilee and Samaria enjoyed a time of peace and was strengthened. Living in the fear of the Lord and encouraged by the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers." The church had just gone through an intense time of persecution; they were dispersed, yet they were walking in a time of peace. He asked those present to pray for our churches to have peace. There was also a spirit of unity.

Jim said when he was pastor of Friendship, he and his secretary, Ms. Barbra would pray together: that if anyone walked through the church doors who was going to be an element of disunity, he prayed for them to have a flat tire." Do whatever it takes to keep them away from Friendship, Lord; and the Lord honored that." The scriptures also said, "be built up." It's not necessarily speaking of church numbers but of being encouraged. Jim prays that our churches would be encouraged and see the Go-Jesus moments, daily, weekly; with people anticipating God to show up. He also prays that our churches would be engaged in discipleship; and that our people would know that baptism is the starting line into mature believers. Finally, our scripture says, they were multiplied. He prays that our

churches will be increased numerically. In 2022, there were 200,000 people in Santa Rosa County. The Chamber of Commerce said that there were 130 churches in Santa Rosa County. "Presumably, we were at one time in the World Guinness Book of Records. Do the math! If every one of our county churches had 1,000 people that would only be 130,000 people, leaving 70,000 unchurched people. Do you think there's a need to church plant? Absolutely. Is there a need to reach out and get outside of our holy huddle? Absolutely. A statistic is that every day in Florida, 619 people are stepping out into eternity. How many are going into eternity apart from our Lord and Savior? We must be outward thinking."

"To celebrate what happened in 2024, we began with a Prayer Conference at FBC Milton with speaker Pastor Josh Walnoffer of Klondike Baptist shared on Reviving Joy related to prayer. Notes on that and other events are on our website. To follow that, Tax Update for pastors and financial secretaries, led by Charissa Cotten, CPA, and SRBA Stewardship Ministry Leader led this annual association event. Youth Pastors came together Disciple Now in February Disciple Now (DNOW) - the student pastors from sister churches come together to plan this associationwide evangelistic event. This year it was celebrated at Immanual. Port City worship band came from the University of Mobile and led worship and Alvin Smith brought the Word. Leaders Bo Mills, Tanner Guidry, and Cameron Theodos put in a whole lot of work that week, and when you showed up, you could tell. A lot of kids made decisions for Christ that weekend. In March, Pine Terrace hosted the West Region VBS training. In this season, there were over 60 decisions for Christ. Later in March, Royal Ambassadors and Girls in Action had a Field Day at Camp Paquette with an option to camp out overnight. Activities included knot tying, fishing, archery, softball throw, hike, tug of war, and we heard missionary testimonies. Pastor Matt Dobson was instrumental in making that happen. Mid-April, Pine Terrace hosted a Regional Sunday School Conference. The focus was on the Five Mindsets of the Christian Educator. Content experts were brought in for children all the way through adults, in break-out classes. Late spring, we had state Association Bible Drills. In summer, Olive hosted the Regional Disaster Relief Training. For disaster relief, the FL Baptist Convention is making it easy to get training in about 4 or 5 things on their website." He then listed many churches that traveled on missions through the summer and the locations they traveled to with the gospel. Santa Rosa Shores hosted the Mobile Dental Unit in the spring and Pine Terrace partnered with Ferris Hill and hosted it late August – September.

"Former AMS, Chip Fox by divine intervention, met Aslam at a Southern Baptist Convention about 5 years ago. We have got to aid Aslam and plant churches in Pakistan. To date, this year, 1900 baptisms." A short video clip was shown of some of the work there. "The last ministry mentioned where God is working mightily is the foster/partnership agreements that have happened within our association last year; Wallace partnered with FBC Navarre, with Pastor Greg Love. This year, Pine Terrace partnered with Ferris Hill and right now, FBC Milton is kind of in the works in partnering with New Life. These are exciting times thinking of what God is going to do in bringing those churches together." When AMS, Jim first came to the association there were 6 churches without pastors. Today, Greg Love is pastor of Navarre FBC, Raymond Dye is pastor of Ferris Hill, John Vickers is pastor at Gulf Breeze and John Edwards is pastor of New Bethel." He asked for prayer for those churches without pastors, Olivet, New Life, and Cora. "These churches have outstanding interims, and God is working within them with each church having baptisms and someone was called into ministry! It has been a very busy year, but it's been a fruitful year. Going back to our theme, "How Good It Is" when our people work together. We're coming together strong so that 200,000 people of Santa Rosa County can be reached for the gospel. Make it your goal to be fruitful, not busy."

- 14. A Short Intermission was called for 10 minutes.
- 15. Memorial Recognition of Association Church Deceased Members.
- 16. Cameron Theodos, Music Minister of Immanuel Baptist invited participation and led a time of Worship.
- 17. AMS, Jim Waters introduced Lewis Miller, West Regional Catalyst for the Florida Baptist Convention, to give the message. It is a farewell challenge because Bro. Lewis will be retiring in November. He read from Matthew Chapter 9:38. It was discussed earlier that our goal for next year in Santa Rosa Baptist Association is to be fruitful, not busy and there's a big difference between the two. That's what Lewis spoke about as it relates to missional clarity. He has a friend in ministry who frequently leads his people with this phrase, "Mission is boss." What is leading us, what is driving us, what compels us; Mission is boss. What he means by that is effective ministry is fueled by a clear mission.

It is likewise a way to measure fruitfulness in ministry. As we think about this goal for next year of fruitfulness, let's ask ourselves, "Are we accomplishing our mission?" The mission that God gave us. A review of this is Luke 19:10, Jesus said, "The Son of Man came to seek and save the lost." His mission was clear, and then He said, "Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." So, He invited us to join Him in that mission. Just before leaving Earth, He said, Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations." Make disciples. You're clear on the mission and you realize you've been empowered to do it. (Acts 1:8) "When the Spirit comes upon you, you will receive power be witnesses." A witness tells others what he knows. I'll empower you to tell them what you know and as you tell them what you know, I'll do the harvest; I'll be the one to save them. You want to be saved by Jesus, not Lewis.

Matthew 9:38: "Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the Harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Anytime you see the word 'Therefore' at the beginning of a sentence, you have to see what it's there for. Back in verse 35, we see what therefore is there for. It says, "Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. Verse 36, "When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them for they were harassed and helpless like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. And then it picks up in verse 38, "Therefore, pray earnestly..." These preceding verses present to us the rationale for Jesus' call to us for prayer and personal engagement in the harvest. There's two things here and let's look at these first preliminary verses 35 and following.

In Jesus, we see first of all, our example. He's our example in teaching, proclaiming, helping, or ministering, or caring. He is our example in teaching; as followers of him, we are to follow his example. This challenges us to answer the question, "Am I open to be used by Jesus to teach, to proclaim, to care for those around me? Are you open? Lord Jesus, this verse shows me you went through all Galilee teaching, proclaiming and caring. So, Jesus is our example in teaching, proclaiming, and ministering.

Second, I want you to see in Jesus how we embrace the culture; the people that live around us. He had compassion, He saw their condition; they were harassed and helpless. It communicates the idea of having no purpose, no guidance. The meaning behind those words is of sheep that have been ravaged by their false shepherds (the Pharisees of their day). One writer said that these words could be literally construed as torn or thrown down. That sounds desperate. It sounds a lot like our culture today. When we consider this context in light of the 200,000 people that make up Santa Rosa County, what do you see? I ask two questions, When I look at the culture, what do I see? "Where is our broken hearts for the lostness? How does it move me? It ought to move us; Jesus was moved with compassion. Jesus wanted to move; compassion is a pained feeling and a deep desire to remove some of those sufferings. Jesus wanted to do something about the fact that they were torn and thrown down. He was moved by compassion, and saw their condition, and said this can't keep going on. Jesus saw the shape of the sheep and it bothered him, moved him, and burdened him. How does it move us? How does your understanding of those lost 200,000 people in Santa Rosa County move you? We see in Jesus not only our example in teaching, proclaiming, and caring; but we see in Jesus how to embrace the culture.

The third thing we see in Jesus, an invitation to mission engagement. He's inviting you and me to get involved; to engage into the reality of "His harvest". We get to participate; He does the work. The harvest is plentiful, there are people all around us. We realize many will not respond positively to the gospel, but we cannot deny that the harvest is plentiful. There are thousands of people needing Jesus all around us. God knows those who will respond positively, so He's empowered us again, to be those witnesses that we talked about earlier.

A second observation about the realities of the mission invitation is that the laborers are few. The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. We're unable to meet the needs of our culture. So, what do we do? We lead those who will respond, lead and disciple them, and call them out to join us in the harvest. Let's walk the Word with them, let's grow in relationship with Jesus with them, let's debrief life together, and let's challenge each other to be witnesses. You don't have any idea who will pray to receive Christ, but you ought to be accused of trying. We ought to try minimally of trying to talk to somebody about Jesus. Jesus had 12 disciples, and he called out the 70, and the need was great in His culture; in His day, in His time; knowing that they could not reap the harvest on his own – He calls us, He invites us to action, to involvement. In verse 38, it says, "He calls us to pray. Pray. When you say you'll pray for someone, do it! Wherever you are, stop and pray with them right there, wherever you are. When you're asked to pray, pray earnestly, with a depth of sincerity. Why? Because prayer acknowledges our inability to accomplish the task; we need God. None

of us can do this work on our own. We need each other and we need God more than anything to help us. Praying invites the wisdom that God has, praying communicates the urgency of the need and our availability. A quote from the President of the Florida Baptist Convention and Senior Pastor of FBC of Chipley, Mike Orr, said, "Prayer is a massive weapon against spiritual warfare;" a massive weapon against our enemy. Then he said, "One that is often unused." If we have a massive weapon, why wouldn't we employ it? God says in 1 John 5:14, "This is the confidence we have in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us." We pray because we can't do this work without him. Our first step to obediently join him in his harvest is to pray. Step one is to pray. Then he doesn't leave us there, he says to pray to the source. Pray to the Lord of the harvest. That communicates ownership. He owns the harvest. God sent Jesus to provide the means of the harvest through salvation. John speaks of this at the baptism of Jesus, about Jesus in Matthew, Chapter 3:12. "His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire." Friends, there's going to be a day, "that day." His winnowing fork is in his hand, today, and he's going to gather his wheat into his barn. Lord, will you give us one more day; just one more day; to talk to one more person about you, to engage in the harvest, and to pray for the harvest? He says the chaff will burn with unquenchable fire. Jesus is the owner of the harvest, so we pray to the source of the harvest.

Notice the third thing of prayer, the substance of those prayers. We pray not just to the source of the harvest, but he will send out laborers. "Send out" speaks of, thrust out, or throw out which speaks to the urgent need that there is. It could be understood as "light a fire." Lord, light a fire in them as they go out. Light a fire in those who have become indifferent to the culture they live in. There's got to be a difference in us. It's all about Jesus, we're not worthy." Lewis concluded by reading an excerpt from "Calling Out the Called" by Shane Pruitt. About a Christian who worked with a coworker for a year before going to seminary. He wore Christian t-shirts to work and tuned into Christian music within earshot of his co-worker. Toward the end of the year, the co-worker came to work excited and told his friend that he had gone to church, heard the gospel, and accepted Christ. He then asked his friend why he never shared the gospel with him, when they both knew that those who die without trusting in Jesus would be eternally separated from the Goodness of God and spend an eternity in hell. He asked the Christian, "Didn't you care enough to tell me that"? We need to pray that God will light that kind of fire in our hearts. For people that have worked right beside us and have for years, and talked about everything but Jesus. Lord, light that fire in my heart. Let's agree to stop making excuses. Let's take every opportunity we've been given to share the gospel, to call out others to join us in the harvest. We do it first by praying, and second-by talking and sharing, and inviting. We must encourage those that we disciple to listen for and to respond to the call of God. Romans 10:14. You and me are that someone. We're the ones to preach the good news. Will we join Jesus in his redemptive mission? Lewis then prayed over the attendees. Jim Waters invited former AMS Chip Fox and his wife Janet to come forward. Chip spoke and remembered the initiation of Regional Catalysts in the Florida Baptist Convention and shared gratitude for Lewis Miller's service to the Santa Rosa Baptist Association.

- 18. Jim Waters prayed over both Lewis Miller and his wife, Becky. He then recognized Jim Stickle, with a Moderator 2024 plaque expressing his gratitude for his service.
- 19. Pastor Chad Diamond prayed over the Association 2025 leadership, blessed the meal, and closed the meeting in prayer.

On March 2, Pine Terrace hosted our Annual West Region Vacation Bible School (VBS) Training. Many from our region attended and attendees were given many resources and ideas to aid in planning and running a VBS for their respective churches.

Later in March, many young students from all over the region came to Camp Paquette for a Royal Ambassador and Girls in Action Field Day. Camp Paquette is a hidden jewel a few miles north of the intersection of Munson Hwy. and Hwy 4. The students that attended had the opportunity to participate in many activities (fishing, knot tying, softball throw, archery, high ropes, tug of war, and missionary testimonies). Matt Dobson (interim pastor out at Cora Baptist) was instrumental in organizing this event. Katherine Green, from Avalon, won the High School division. Audrey Baugas, from Pine Terrace/Friendship, was the runner up in the youth division. What a blessing to have students in our association hiding God's Word in their heart!

In June, many of churches started out with Florida Baptist Disaster Relief Training at Olive Baptist in Pensacola. This was a time of training and fellowship with all the Disaster Relief personnel from the West Region. The Florida Baptist Convention has provided several training opportunities on the Convention website: https://flbaptist.org/ Go to the ministries drop down menu and choose disaster relief for training opportunities and background checks.

Several of our churches went on mission trips this summer. Friendship - New Orleans, Pine Terrace - Miami, Alaska, Mexico, Utah, Immanuel - Scotland, Knoxville, Peru, Greece, Dominican Republic, Arkansas, New Orleans, Calvary -Tennessee, Wisconsin, Avalon-Montana, FBC Milton-Memphis, Manchester, England, Missouri, FBC Navarre-Ohio, Cuba. What a blessing to see all our churches reaching to our nation and to the nations!

One of the local ministries that a few of our churches used was the Florida Baptist Dental Bus. Santa Rosa Shores hosted the bus in Gulf Breeze earlier in the year, while Pine Terrace in partnership with Ferris Hill hosted the bus at the end of the summer. The Florida Baptist Convention is always looking for churches that would desire to host this evangelistic tool from the Florida Baptist Convention.

August means back-to school and many churches did backpack ministries for back to school such as Ferris Hill, FBC Milton, Pine Terrace, and Immanuel. As summer closed several events were hosted at FBC Milton in September. First, the North American Mission Board held a Church Planting Lab at FBC Milton. This was a time for churches, that were interested in planting churches, to come and glean both best practices and opportunities through NAMB.

Also, later that month, FBC Milton hosted Senior Fest. Right at 200 people were involved from 11 churches in our area. Gary Nichols and the FBC Leadership team did a great job organizing and hosting this event. The day was a great blessing! Dr. Clayton Cloer, the President of the Baptist University of Florida, was the keynote speaker. Buddy Liles, former bass singer for the Florida Boys, provided special music. Claine Roberts led us congregational good ole fashion gospel music. Finally, we were blessed by the world-famous chef, Debbie Basset for lunch.

One area that God is on the move is in the Vietnamese population in our county. Two churches have started this year and will be petitioning to join the SRBA at the next annual meeting. Please be praying for Christian Phan (Gulf Breeze) and Robert Lepine (East Milton) as they lead these new congregation.

I'll mention another of the SRBA's great partnerships. Each year we partner with a group of Pakistani pastors through a gentlemen Chip Fox met several years ago. This year to date (Early October) this ministry has baptized over 1500 people. We also have the opportunity to do a zoom training with these pastors early each fall.

The last ministry I will mention is that a number of churches have entered into foster care covenants with each other this past year. Wallace Baptist has partnered with FBC Navarre. Pine Terrace has partnered with Ferris Hill. FBC Milton is in the process of partnering with New Life. We have been blessed to see how God uses these partnerships for His Glory.

As you can see it has been a busy, but fruitful year. Going back to our theme for this annual meeting. "How Good it Is" when churches partner together for the Gospel. Continue to pray for the upcoming year as we seek to reach Santa Rosa County with the gospel of Jesus.

Executive Committee

February 2024 —Treasurer's Report: Expenses for the 2023 year were more than Income by a little over \$3,600. January the Association held the annual Tax Update, with a good attendance and also a Prayer Conference focused on "Reviving Joy" led by Reverend Joshua Walnoffer, held at Milton First. The Association bought drone/video equipment and is uploading a promotional video on a church every other week on their website. There was a MOTION made to approve Pastor Jeremy Holley as Moderator-Elect on the Association Council. RECOMMENDATON made by Council to the Executive Committee the approval of Association's review and recommend changes to Association's current by-laws and to update them due to their being outdated in the current way that the Association does business, Vote taken and approved when by-laws edited and approved by the Executive Committee, the Association's edited by-laws would be voted on at the upcoming Annual Meeting in October.

May 2024 – From the State Board of Missions reported that Dr. Tommy Green, FL Baptist Convention President, announced his retirement at the end of 2024. The Vietnamese Church Plant in Navarre had their launch out of Santa Rosa Shores on March 10 and East Side has opened its doors to a Vietnamese Church plant in East Milton. Disciple NOW (DNOW) Feb. 16-17 @ Immanuel, students from 14 churches participated with 50 decisions for Christ. Some were rededications and some were called to ministry. Pine Terrace came alongside Ferris Hill in a foster-care partnership; it will conclude in September and has done well. Wallace came alongside Navarre FBC in a foster-care partnership. New Life, because of a deep dive, voted to pursue a fostering partnership. There was a MOTION made to approve Kohlmyn McLean as the new Association treasurer on the Association Council. Vote approved. Pakistani ministry has baptized 1800 people to date.

August 2024--From the State Board of Missions reported that a special-called meeting was formed to vote on the next Florida Baptist Executive Director Treasurer, Dr. Steven Rummage who will be replacing Dr. Tommy Green on August 17, 2024. Tommy Green is going to serve as a special advisor to the Executive Director until Dec. 31, 2024. Also, our West Regional Catalyst, Lewis Miller will be retiring at the end of this year. He will be speaking at our Annual Meeting in October and the Association will be doing something special to appreciate what he's done for our churches these past 9 years. We're seeking to strengthen the partnership of women's ministry in the association. Lauren Holley has recently taken the position of the West Region Consultant for women's ministry working with FL Baptist Convention Women's Ministry Leader, Cindy Bradley. 2 Vietnamese Churches have requested membership to the Association. Pastor Robert Lapine of Living Faith Church locally, hosted by East Side Baptist Church and Pastor Christian Phan of Vietnamese Christian Church in Navarre, sharing facilities at Santa Rosa Shores Baptist Church. 117th Annual Meeting of the Association will be October 13th at Ferris Hill. The theme is "How Good It Is!" Psalm 133:1-3. Celebrating the association churches that have partnered together in unity as witnessed through the deep dives.

October 2024 – The Executive Committee reviewed the 2025 Nominations for SRBA Leadership, the 2025 Proposed Budget, and potential new church membership for Vietnamese Living Faith Church in East Milton and Vietnamese Christian Church in Navarre. These will be voted on at the 117th Annual Meeting, October 13th.

- The amount of \$50 will be allowed for utilities (electricity, water, and gas only); housing (rent and mortgage); and other special needs. If a need exceeds the allotted amount, the Director of Missions may use his discretion, with the amount not to exceed \$100. NO deposits will be paid. The person asking for assistance must be able to show the church requesting for them that they will be able to come up with the full amount of the bill from other resources before the Association releases funds. These are matching funds (the church to provide assistance and the Association will match the funds up to \$50).
- ☐ The Association will reimburse a church \$25 with food assistance. If you have questions, please contact the Association Office concerning benevolence.

Report of Agencies and Institutions 2023-24



pleased to share the following highlights of all God has done in the life of the University over the previous year. Please

continue to pray for us as we labor to equip the next generation to push back the darkness in Florida and beyond.

- 673 students enrolled for the Fall semester which marks the highest enrollment in the University's history!
- Our graduate programs grew from 20 students in 2023-2024 to more than 190 in the Fall 2024 semester.
- Impact 1:8 is an initiative for all Theology students to serve in ministry-related activities and evangelism. In the previous school year, students shared their faith 341 times and participated in 337 ministry events.
- BUF Hispano programs began in January 2024 in Orlando. Undergraduate and Graduate programs are taught in Spanish and bi-lingually. We currently have more than 270 students enrolled and expect to add 100 more students during the year for a total of 370 students. Dual credit programs are being offered with academies across Latin America.
- BUF Francais has more than 90 students currently enrolled in South and Central Florida. Enrollment is anticipated to reach 100 students in the second Fall Term that begins on October 24.
- BUF was approved by SEVIS to offer all degree programs to international students. Our Miami campus is serving students from India enrolled in our MBA Data Analytics program. Promotion is underway.
- BUF Calvary College, the new commuter location for BUF in Clearwater at Calvary Baptist Church, is now

online! The covenant agreement with Calvary was signed in January 2024. Dr. Doug Hankins has been named the Director of the Calvary College site.

- With the launch of BUF Athletics, a new, competitive, regulation-size gym floor has been installed in our Wellness Center on our Graceville Campus. We look forward to launching Volleyball, Basketball, and Cross County in 2024-2025 while working towards Baseball and Softball thereafter. Interviews for team coaches are underway.
- Renovations have been completed in Brackin-Chandler Hall, Napier Hall, and Smith Hall. The level of finishes and quality of work allows us to compete at a higher level of recruitment for on-campus students.
- Currently, 249 students are in programs preparing for vocational ministry in the local church.
- BUF Portuguese launches in January 2025 in Orlando.
- All of our programs and courses are available online.

For 120 years, One More Child has stood in the gap, delivering Christ-centered services to the most vulnerable among us. Our commitment to reach one more extends to hungry children, foster children, trafficked children, single moms, and struggling families. Since our inception, the love of Christ remains the cornerstone upon which we build every program and initiative.

In 2023, we cared for 250,259 children and individuals and provided more than 19 million meals nationally and globally. This was possible because more than 140,000 individuals said "yes" to training, volunteering, and awareness efforts. Despite our operations and staff facing unprecedented demand, with the support of Florida Baptists, we continue to expand and carry out this essential work as we:

- SERVE FLORIDA'S HUNGRY CHILDREN AND AT-RISK FAMILIES. We are on track to provide
 more meals to hungry children and struggling families than ever before. Through our family support
 programs, child hunger initiatives, global sponsorships, and the addition of more service locations,
 including the Azinger Family Compassion Center in Bradenton, we were able to provide 19,580,059
 meals in 2023. We are grateful for the amazing partner churches and schools that have helped us
 serve families locally and globally with the blessing of food.
- SERVE FOSTER CHILDREN THROUGHOUT FLORIDA. We are placing children in foster homes and
 recruiting and licensing new foster families daily. Our foster care teams have streamlined the licensing
 process and are recruiting more diligently than ever to meet the growing need. We are leaning on the
 Church as so many Florida Baptists provide incredible wraparound support for families, such as respite
 care, meals, clothing, and more. We also celebrate that 148 children needing a forever home were
 placed with an adoptive family last year.
- SERVE FLORIDA'S TRAFFICKED CHILDREN AND TEENS. In 2023, our 24/7 Anti-Trafficking Mobile
 Teams served an unprecedented 1,007 anti-trafficking clients and over 12,969 people through our
 advocacy and awareness efforts. Through continued partnerships with state and local government
 leaders, law enforcement agencies, and churches, we are equipped to help more survivors than ever
 before.
- SERVE SINGLE MOMS AND THEIR CHILDREN. We continue to care for the needs of single moms
 and their children. Through the solid foundation they have received in our programs and the support
 they find in local churches, these moms find stability and self-sufficiency. In 2023, we celebrated an
 86% successful completion rate for the 265 mothers and their children in our Single Moms program.
 Participants saved more than \$200,000, allowing some to purchase their first home.
- MEET THE NEEDS OF STRUGGLING FAMILIES. As many families struggle with job loss, financial difficulty, and housing challenges, our Family Support program provides sustaining resources such as groceries, diapers, skills training, household items, and more. We served more than 2,297 families in 2023.

Historical Events

- Avalon Baptist Church: We had 10 people go on a short term mission trip to Montana. We had 34 people baptized. We have a new associate pastor, Matthew Ayala. We ordained Pastor Tim York, We sent 2 to live on campus to Florida Baptist College, 1 started with the online seminary with Liberty University and 1 graduating from Dallas International University with dual masters. We also have 1 interning as a church planter.
- East Side Baptist Church: Began hosting the Vietnamese Living Faith Church on Sunday, June 30. There is no charge for the use of the Church facilities because people are gathering to worship our great God and Savior!
- Ferris Hill Baptist Church: In 2023, Ferris Hill Baptist Church conducted a diagnostic "Deep Dive" in partnership with Santa Rosa Baptist Association AMS Jim Waters and Pensacola Bay Baptist Association Executive Director and AMS Brian Nall. The Deep Dive provided a clear picture as to the health of Ferris Hill and gave clarity for best next steps related to reaching our community, church attendance, financial health, worship services, facility needs, outreach/evangelism efforts, body life, and leadership. This report provided guidance on Ferris Hill's needs and the church partnered with Pine Terrace Baptist Church in a fostering type of relationship in late 2023 and into 2024. Over the past year, great strides were made in the areas highlighted in the Deep Dive Report leading to improved church health and prepared Ferris Hill to receive her new Pastor. On June 1, 2024, Ray Dye became Ferris Hill's new Pastor and church has experienced significant numerical growth and a marked increase in believer's baptisms!
- **Floridatown Baptist Church:** Continued improvements to the fellowship hall with new Lighting and flooring. Replaced two air conditioners in sanctuary at \$10,000 each and all costs paid in full.
- Immanuel Baptist Church (IBC): Immanuel Baptist Church broke ground on its new building on March 10, 2024. The foundation has been laid, steel has been put up, and the air conditioning units have been installed. This facility will provide a large space for Student Worship and Bible study, more adult classrooms, and a community gathering area for fellowship and connecting. We look forward to its completion in mid-2025. IBC continues to see record numbers of new believers being obedient to the Lord and getting baptized. The growth of the student and young adult ministries has resulted in 17 young people surrendering to the call of ministry. Two new staff positions have been added in the past year: a Middle School Minister and a Student Outreach Minister. The church has partnered with John Melvin Christian College, providing support through mentoring, encouragement, and prayer. The Immanuel missions team also manages a Samarians Purse Disaster Relief truck that is used regionally.
- **Living Truth:** Planted a church in Cantonment with Pastor Jeff Cranford.
- Navarre First Baptist Church had it's 39th Anniversary, June 23, 2024.
- Olivet Baptist Church: Pastor Wendell Stokes retired at Easter. We currently have an Interim Pastor Chip Fox. Olivet is undergoing a Deep Dive ministry evaluation.

Associational Covenant for Santa Rosa Baptist Association

Being led, as we believe, by the Holy Spirit, to enter into covenant as an association of churches, we join ourselves together through this larger fellowship:

To watch over one another in love and to nurture the spiritual welfare of fellowship of all churches in the association;

To provide a forum for the consideration of our Christian faith and the evaluation of those points of doctrine and policy which affect our life together.

To assist the churches in planning, conducting evaluations and improving their programs of work designed to reach their objectives.

To carry out the Great Commission of the Lord both within and beyond the bounds of the association; and

To facilitate the exchange of information and assistance between the covenanting churches and the Florida Baptist and Southern Baptist Conventions and their agencies and to maintain interaction with community agencies and other Christian bodies.

Note: Adopted during Annual Session, 1972

Article of Faith

- 1. We believe in only one living and true God, the Father, and Holy Ghost and these three are one, created, preserves and governs all things after the councils of His own will.
- 2. The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, containing His Revealed will and the only rule of faith and practice.
- 3. That man was first created in a holy and happy condition, but, by transgression, he fell from that state, became depraved, and as he was the covenant head of his posterity, they are born in sin and unless they be born of the Spirit, continue dead in trespasses and sin, being destitute of real holiness and possess enmity of heart against God.
- 4. That the Lord Jesus Christ, who was eternally with the Father, was in the fullness of time, manifested in the flesh, in which he fulfilled the law, suffered and died, to make atonement for sin, is the only Savior, Prophet, Priest, and King, appointed heir of all things and judge of the quick and dead.
- 5. We believe in the election according to the foreknowledge of God, the Father, through sanctification of the spirit, unto obedience and the sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ.
- 6. Those who are thus united to Christ by a living faith have the full and free forgiveness of their sins, which favor is bestowed, not on account of any work which they may have done, but solely on account of the merits of Christ, arising from His suffering and death.

- 7. That all those who are born of the Spirit and justified by the reputed righteousness of Christ, will persevere unto the end, being kept by the power of God, through faith, unto salvation.
- 8. That visible Churches are to be formed only of professing believers in Jesus Christ, who may give satisfactory evidence of a change of heart, wrought by the good Spirit of God and baptized by a proper administrator. That Christian baptism is the immersion of the whole body in water, in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, to show forth in solemn and beautiful emblem, our faith in a crucified, buried and risen Savior and that is prerequisite to church membership, but has no connection with the great work of regeneration, or the new birth.
- 9. That the Lord's Supper is an ordinance of the New Testament, showing for the His Death and consists in the reception of bread and wine, and is to be observed by those only who have been baptized and become regular members of a Gospel church.
- 10. That God having appointed the preaching of the Gospel for the edification of the Church and the advancement of His kingdom in the world, therefore it is our duty to contribute to its support, as Divine Providence may give us ability.
- 11. That the government of the Church is not to be vested in the hands of any man, or number of men, distract from the body, but is to be conducted solely by the church herself.
- 12. That the first day of the week, called Sabbath, or Lord's Day, is to be sanctified by attending to the worship of God, in public and in private, abstaining from unnecessary visiting, trifling conversation, labor, etc. except as much as may be directed to works of necessity and mercy.
- 13. That when time shall be nor more, the Son of Man will return to judge the world in righteousness, that bodies of all men will be raised from the dead and brought to the judgment seat of Christ where the righteous will be rewarded with eternal life and the wicked sentenced to eternal misery.

Constitution and By-laws

Santa Rosa Baptist Association

PREAMBLE:

We, the Baptist Churches of Santa Rosa County, have seen the need of organizing an Association of Churches in order to have a more effective ministry in the spread of the gospel of Jesus Christ. The purpose of the Association is to help the churches to elicit, combine, and direct their energies under the leadership of the Holy Spirit in the extension of the Kingdom of God. It is not the purpose, nor does the Association have the authority, to exercise ecclesiastical jurisdiction over the churches of which it is composed.

ARTICLE I - NAME

This body shall be called the Santa Rosa Baptist Association.

ARTICLEII - PURPOSE

The purpose of the Association shall be: 1) To advise, give counsel, and propose measures for the advancement of the ministry of cooperating Southern Baptist churches within the bounds of the Association and "to the region beyond: through the Leadership of the Holy Spirit and in cooperation with the Florida Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention; 2) To promote love, fellowship, and cooperation among the churches, and to provide occasions for same; 3) To train leadership and provide resources for same; 4) To establish, maintain, and supervise new Ministries and new missions until such time as a suitable sponsoring church can be enlisted, and to guide and assist new churches; 5) To encourage the churches in evangelism, missions, benevolence, and Christian education as fostered by the Florida Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention; and 6) To establish and conduct such other institutions of a religious, educational, charitable and benevolent character as may be approved by the Association.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1: This Association shall be composed of Southern Baptist Churches of like faith and practice, which subscribe to the 2000 Baptist Faith and Message or a similar declaration of faith, in Santa Rosa County and surrounding areas which are in cooperation with this Association and sympathetic with its purpose and work.

SECTION 2: Any church desiring membership in the Association shall present a Petitionary Letter to the Association Council of the Association no later than August 1. The Association Council shall report such petitions to the Executive Committee no later than the October meeting, and to the Annual Meeting of the association. The Association Council shall conduct its work in accordance with the Policies and Procedures Manual for accepting new churches into the Association. Petitions for membership shall be considered at the Annual Meeting of the Association only. When the petitioning church is accepted, the Moderator shall extend the right hand of fellowship to its members.

SECTION 3: The Santa Rosa Baptist Association's Annual Meeting shall be composed of messengers from member Southern Baptist Churches. Each church shall be entitled to four (4) elected messengers for up to one hundred (100) resident members and a minimum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) annual contribution to the Association, and one (1) additional messenger for each fifty (50) additional resident members, or major fraction thereof; and each additional fifty dollars (\$50) annual contribution, but no church shall be entitled to more than twelve (12) messengers.

SECTION 4: Each church shall annually provide to the clerk of the Association an annual statistical profile which demonstrates its cooperation and partnership with other Santa Rosa Baptist Association churches. This report shall be made on forms provided by the Southern Baptist Convention, called "Annual Church Profile," or successive forms provided by the denomination and approved by the Association.

SECTION 5: If a question is raised with the Executive Committee about a church's cooperation or faith and practice, the Executive Committee may refer the matter to the Association Council for review. The purpose of this review will be to encourage the church to participate as a cooperating church of like faith and practice in the Association. The Association Council shall report the results of this review to the Executive Committee. If further action is necessary after this review, such action shall be recommended by the Executive Committee to the Association at its next annual meeting.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

SECTION 1: The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and any other Director(s) or representatives the Association or the Executive Committee deems necessary. All Associational officers shall serve a period of one year or until a successor is elected. The Moderator shall not succeed himself. The State Board of Missions Representative is recommended to the State Convention, who elects that person for a three-year term.

SECTION 2: The Associational Council shall consist of Treasurer, Moderator, one representative from the Transformation Team, one representative from the Family Life Team, two representatives from the Leadership Development Team, and two representatives from the Community Connection Team. Each team shall appoint their representatives not later than November 15 of each year. Nominations may be received from the floor at the Annual Meeting, providing that the person nominated has been contacted prior to nomination and has agreed to serve if elected. Elected Messengers (ARTICLE 111, SECTION 3) shall be polled to elect any officer when nominated from the floor for any office. The Moderator, Vice Moderator, Clerk, and Association Council, in counsel with the Director of Associational Missions, shall be responsible for preparing a Calendar of Activities for the Association, budgeting, and nominating. The calendar is to be ready for distribution to the churches by October 1 of every year. The Moderator shall serve as Chairman of the Council.

SECTION 3: All officers, committees and committee chairmen shall function according to the "Task Descriptions" outlined in the Santa Rosa Baptist Association Policies and Procedures Manual current edition. The manual may be amended by recommendation of the Association Council to the Executive Committee in writing, by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members of the Executive Committee present and voting. At least twenty-eight (28) days must elapse between the presentation of the recommendation to amend and the Executive Committee's voting on the amendment.

SECTION 4. All Associational officers shall be available to the churches in assisting them to develop programs as requested by the individual church.

SECTION 5. All officers of the Association shall be members of churches affiliated and cooperating with Santa Rosa Baptist Association.

ARTICLE V - DIRECTOR OF ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONS

There shall be a Director of Associational Missions who shall oversee and encourage the work of the Santa Rosa Baptist Association. The duties of the Director of Associational Missions are defined in a job description included in the Manual. His office is supervised by the Association Council of the Association.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

SECTION 1: Executive Committee: The Association shall have an Executive Committee which shall act for the Association in all matters not otherwise provided for between annual sessions. Membership on the Executive Committee shall be based on the same qualifications as required for Messengers to the annual meeting of the Association, limited to the number of members specified in this Section. The Association year end report will

be used to determine a church's qualification to have members on the Executive Committee. If during the year a church meets the criteria, the Executive Committee may accept that church's request for representation on the Executive Committee. Membership on the Executive Committee shall be as follows, based on a church's meeting the criteria as stated above: the pastor and one other staff member (full time, part time, bi-vocational, or volunteer) all of whom must be members of the affiliated church; two lay persons from each church; Association officers, program leaders, and committee chairpersons. At any time that an Executive Committee member ceases to be a member of an affiliated and cooperating church, he/she shall no longer be a member of the Executive Committee. Paid Associational staff shall not be voting members of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall meet quarterly on the first Monday in the month (February, May, August, and October) or at other times as deemed convenient.

SECTION 2: The Association shall have the following four Ministry Teams with a chairperson and associate chairperson: Administrative, Church Ministry Development, Community Connection, and Leadership Development. These team members shall be nominated by the Association Council and approved by the Executive Committee at the first session of the Annual Meeting of the Association, and the vote taken at the second session. Other nominations will be received from the floor provided the nominee has been contacted prior to the nomination and has agreed to serve if elected. These teams shall begin function at the close of the Annual Meeting of the Association at which they are elected and shall serve for the period for which they are elected.

SECTION 3: Responsibilities of Committees: The duties and responsibilities of each committee are to be outlined in the Santa Rosa Baptist Association Policies and Procedures Manual.

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS

SECTION 1: The Association shall have the option to hold its Annual Meeting, afternoon and evening, on any day of the third week in October. However, if expedience demands, the Executive Committee shall have the right to alter the date.

SECTION 2: The messengers present shall be considered a quorum in the Annual Meeting and all called sessions of the Association. A majority of mes-sengers present and voting shall be necessary for the Association to act.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this Constitution may be made only at regular Annual Meetings of the Association. Such changes or amendments shall be presented in printed form to all messengers present, and, if deemed necessary, read to the Association at the first session and re-read at the second session. It shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of messengers present and voting to become effective.

ARTICLE IX - BY-LAWS

This Association shall have a brief code of By-laws accompanying its Consti-tution, which may be changed or amended by a majority vote at the Annual Meeting of the Association.

- BY-LAW 1: Each session of the Association shall be opened and closed with appropriate devotional services.
- BY-LAW 2: All sessions shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order (current revision).
- BY-LAW 3: The Clerk is responsible for having the minutes of the Association ready for publication within sixty (60) days following the last day of the Annual Meeting of the Association. If this deadline is not met, the Clerk is to provide an explanation to the Executive Committee.
- BY-LAW 4: Churches who are members of the Association must have their annual letters in the hands of the Clerk no later than October 5 of each year.

Church History of Replicate Church

In 2018, God burdened a group of believers for the lost living in East Milton, FL. This group of people began to pray fervently and seek God's will. Over time God's vision for this group and East Milton became clear. God was calling this group of people to engage this community with the Gospel, make disciples, and plant a church.

In view of this call in 2019, a small group of people began serving and engaging the community of East Milton in various capacities. By the end of 2019 this small group of people had multiplied into four small groups of people engaging the community with the Gospel.

In 2020, Living Truth Church in Pace, FL officially sent this group of people out to plant a church in East Milton. 2020 was also the year of the pandemic, and so Replicate church launched their official first Sunday gathering online, Palm Sunday of 2020. Though Replicate church did not meet in person until June of 2020, the church still spent that season serving and loving the community of East Milton. In the fall of 2023, Replicate Church petitioned to join the Santa Rosa Baptist Association of churches and was approved at their 116th Annual Meeting; being offered the right hand of fellowship.

From years 2020 until 2025, Replicate Church has celebrated almost 60 baptisms and averages over 150 during Sunday morning gatherings. Replicate has remained steadfast in seeking the welfare of East Milton and pushing back against the lostness that is present there.
